Texas "Move Over, Slow Down" Law Expansion

As you may know, Texas law requires drivers to move over or slow down when passing emergency responders, tow trucks, law enforcement, and utility vehicles stopped on the roadside. As of September 1, 2025, this protection now includes Animal Control vehicles and officers. Please do your part by staying alert for these vehicles and obeying the law by safely moving over to another lane or slowing down.

September 21–27 is Child Passenger Safety Week, with National Seat Check Saturday on September 27. These campaigns are dedicated to helping families keep children safe in cars, especially when using car seats.

Having trouble figuring out which car seat to use? Follow these guidelines for optimal safety:

• Starting at birth, always ride rear-facing until the child reaches height/weight limits allowed by the car seat manufacturer.

- When a child reaches the height/weight limits, they may ride in a forward-facing car seat with a harness and tether.
- When the child reaches the height/weight limits allowed by the forward-facing car seat manufacturer, they may use a booster seat.
- Children should use a booster until the seat belt fits properly. A proper fit for a seat belt means the lap belt is snug across the thighs, and a shoulder belt is across chest/shoulder.
- Always remember, no matter what seat you are using, installing in the back seats of the car is the safest option for all children.

Help keep all children safe by understanding these guidelines and doing research on the best and safest seat option. Always refer to your car seats guidelines for proper installation and limits.
