Halloween is just around the corner, and whether you're behind the wheel or walking through neighborhoods, safety should be a top priority.

Driver Safety Tips

• **Slow down.** Expect more pedestrian traffic and drive below the speed limit in neighborhoods. Be especially cautious when entering or exiting driveways.

- **Reduce Distractions.** That text, call, or candy bar can wait. Keep your eyes on the road. Just one glance down can lead to tragedy.
- **Use your headlights.** Turn on your headlights in the evening, even if it's not completely dark. Increased visibility helps keep trick-or-treaters safe.

Pedestrian Safety Tips

- **Increase visibility.** Try to trick-or-treat before dark, carry a flashlight, or add reflective tape to costumes and treat bags.
- Follow the rules of the road. Use sidewalks and crosswalks whenever they are available. If there are none, walk facing traffic, as far from moving vehicles as possible, and wait for a gap in traffic that allows plenty of time to cross safely.
- Obey signs and signals. Pay attention to "Walk" and "Don't Walk" signs and lights and
 continue to cross as quickly as possible if the sign changes when you are already crossing the
 street.

There are plenty of spooky sights this month—let's make sure crashes aren't one of them. Together, we can make this Halloween a safe and memorable one.



That same spirit of flexibility applies to how you pay for tolls. We offer both in-state and out-of-state electronic tags that save drivers 33% on tolls.


