Welcome to 2026! As we kick off the new year, the Mobility Authority encourages travelers to commit to new habits that make everyday travel safer, easier, and more efficient. Whether your goals include practicing safe driving habits, saving money, or moving more, we've got tips to help you stay on track all year long.

Move Over When It Matters

Safe driving is always a top priority. This year, we're highlighting an important law that's often overlooked: Move over when it's safe to do so. Please remember to move over in the following situations:

- [Texas State Law](#) requires drivers to move over or slow down for emergency and response vehicles, including police, ambulances, tow trucks, construction crews, and animal control vehicles.

- If you're involved in a minor crash or fender bender and no one is seriously injured, pull over to a safe location. Exchange information and make phone calls once you're out of the travel lanes.
- If your vehicle experiences a mechanical issue, pull over safely as soon as possible. Continuing to drive could put you and other drivers at risk.

Thank you for doing your part to help protect drivers, first responders, and roadway crews.

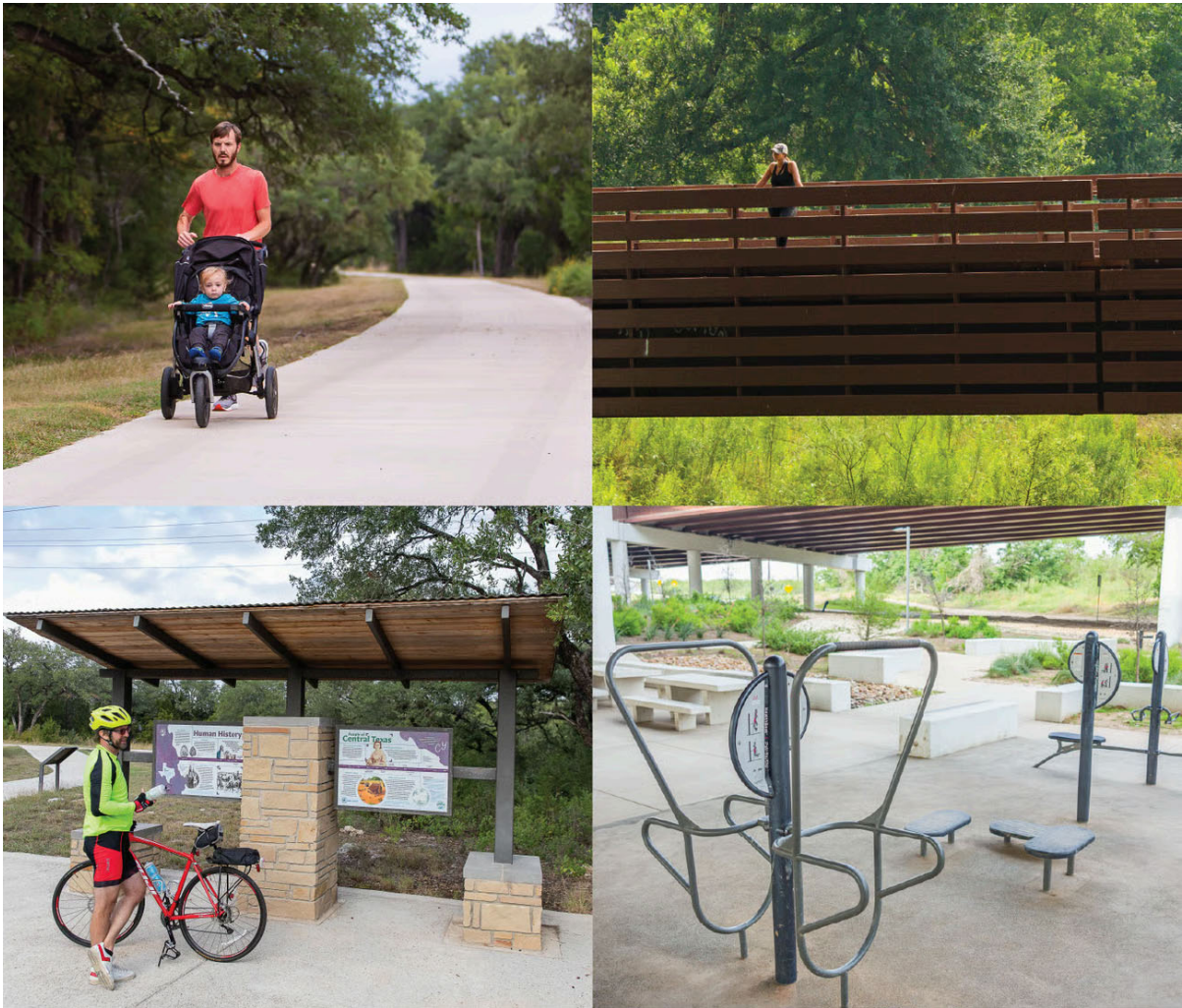
Pay Less This Year

New Year New Options: 183 North Northbound Express Lanes Open

With optionality comes autonomy, and more choices to get you to where you want to go when you want to get there. As of January 2, 2026, the Mobility Authority is excited to provide drivers with another travel option with the opening of the northbound 183 Express Lanes as Phase I of the [183 North Mobility Project](#).

The new tolled express lanes provide an additional travel option between Burnet Road and SH 45 North, offering improved travel reliability, more predictable trip times, and limited entrances and exits to help bypass congestion in the general-purpose lanes.

Coming Soon

- A northbound direct connector from the MoPac Express Lane to the 183 Express Lanes
- Southbound express lanes and a southbound connection to the MoPac Express Lane
